

ATTENTION ALL STATE FINALS QUALIFIERS!!!

CONTESTANTS:

In response to any concerns regarding the recent EHV-1/ EHM virus outbreak and to provide as healthy an environment as possible for our horses we are taking the following steps that all contestants and parents need to be aware of;

- The Eastern Sierra Tri County Fairgrounds management is cleaning the entire fairgrounds and doing everything to eliminate any possibility of exposure to our horses.
- All cutting horses and turnback horses are required to get a health certificate from their veterinarian within 72 hours of arrival to Bishop.
- All horses will be checked by a vet or vet tech at time of arrival to fairgrounds for fever or signs of illness. Any horses with fever or signs of illness will be sent home
- Check in for all contestants with horses will be limited to specific times listed below.
- Campers may enter fairgrounds outside of specified times but horses must be checked in at the following times;

Saturday, June 11, 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m,

Sunday, June 12, 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Monday, June 13, 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Tuesday, June 14, 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

If you come with horses outside of these times you will have to place your horses in the holding pens on the edge of the fairgrounds until the vet or vet tech arrives.

- All contestants that live locally and will be entering the fairgrounds for slack and performances daily will be confined to parking in the infield North east of the arena only.
- There will be two entrances for check in, one for trailers through the front pasture at the entrance of the fairgrounds and one for RV's through the paved driveway entrance. This is to provide a safer unloading area for horses.

We appreciate your cooperation and understanding as we work out the details that have been carefully discussed and agreed upon for our State Finals.

Contestants are reminded to practice good health standards for livestock while at the State Finals, no sharing water troughs, take temperature daily and report a temp of 102 or more, avoid standing with other horses and allowing nose to nose contact.

Avoid grazing on the grass areas. These are all good practices for horse owners at all times and in the event of viral outbreaks.
